Dear parents and carers,

As communicated in an email to you this morning and also on our school facebook page, I would like to confirm with you that a member of our school community has tested positive for COVID-19.

We were notified at 8:34am this morning that our school was non-operational effective immediately for the on-site attendance of students and staff to allow time for contact tracing. I would like to thank our wonderful families for promptly and calmly collecting their children this morning at such short notice and our students who were exceptionally well behaved. I would also like to thank our GPS staff for calmly supervising the students outside and assisting in the safe, socially distanced collection of students.

All staff and students are asked to self-isolate until you receive further advice. There is no requirement to get a COVID-19 test at this time unless you are unwell. Please note: 2021 Kindy Kritters participants are excluded from this advice.

NSW Health has requested anyone who has been unwell or if you develop any symptoms such as a fever, cough, sore throat, shortness of breath, runny nose, loss of smell/taste, muscle/joint pains, diarrhoea, nausea/vomiting or extreme tiredness to be tested at one of the COVID-19 testing clinics.

The NSW Department of Education will continue to work closely with NSW Health to ensure the health and safety of all students and staff is maintained.

The safety and wellbeing of our staff and students is of paramount importance to us at all times. As such we will continue to work closely with NSW Health to ensure that all necessary health advice is adhered to.

Green Level Rewards

Grafton PS have been implementing a new wellbeing policy and a "Green Level Rewards Day" this year. Every child will be entitled to attend rewards day on a point scale system each school term. At the beginning of each term rewards will be announced at school and we will look to publish these reward recipients in the newsletter in the future. Student voice will be important and SRC will take class suggestions to a SRC meeting the term before for suggestions of activities.

Students start each term with the maximum of 40 Star points. Each week students are given a score out of 4 based on the GPS STAR Values (Set a good example, Tolerate Others; Always do your best and Respect everyone). Marks can be changed each week depending on a student's behaviour. Students may have points deducted for detentions, behaviour levels or classroom incidents.

Students who:

- Receive 40 star points can select any activity in the table.
- Receive 39 points will participate in the 39-40 point activity
- Receive 38-34 star points can select any activity in the 38-34 bracket or any activity in a lower point bracket
- Receive 33-26 star points can select any activity in the 33-26 bracket or any activity in a lower point bracket
- Receive less than 25 star points can select from 25 points or less list only.
