Dear Parents and Carers,

This week our families with students in Years 3 and 5 received their NAPLAN results. The students sat assessments in writing, reading, conventions of language (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and numeracy. NAPLAN results allow parents/carers and educators to see how students are progressing in literacy and numeracy over time – individually, as part of their school community, and against national standards. We were very proud of each individual student who gave their best for this one off assessment. The school will be analysing these results and setting school and individual targets in the coming weeks.

Students in Year 6 have commenced their Check In Assessments. These assessments are an additional tool for teachers to gather information about how students are tracking against the syllabus outcomes. Students in Years 3, 4, 5 will complete these online assessments early next term.

As the term draws closer to the holidays, Green Level Reward sessions will be occurring next week for the primary students and in Week 10 for our infants students. Invitations will be sent out based on the option your child has chosen.






BMX - Bicycle Moto Cross, this type of bike became very popular in the 1970s. A small frame with a low-set seat, designed for use in BMX racing and stunt/
