K-2 students participated in various Aboriginal rotational activities. Well done to our Grafton PS Aboriginal Committee for all their hard work in organising our events.

This week your child/children brought home their Semester 1 Reports. As mentioned in a previous newsletter, there were new elements added to our reports. Students and teachers also had input into learning goals for each student. Learning descriptors have been listed for English and mathematics. If your child is working at stage level, this will be indicated by a Sound (C) grade. Teachers' comments describe the skills and knowledge demonstrated by the student as evidence of academic progress. Comments are personalised, they identify areas of strength and at least one area for improvement. I wish to thank the staff for the extensive amount of time and work they put into reports this semester.

It's never an easy thing to be away from loved ones. Our Year 6 students and staff returned from Canberra in the early hours of this morning. It certainly was a chilly week in the capital city, but the students had a blast.
