
Online payments are processed in real-time and can be viewed by school staff immediately.

School Cross Country – 25th March

The annual GPS Cross Country will be held Monday, 25th March, between recess and lunch. As per previous years the event will be conducted at Grafton PS with children running 2 or 3 laps of a clearly marked course.

The children will compete in groups according to the age they turn this year. Please note the 8 and 9 years compete together as a combined group, as do the 12 and 13 year old children. Children up to and including 10 years will run 2 laps (2000m) whilst our 11, 12/13's will run 3 laps of the course. All students with a disability and Provisional Classification will complete the 2000m course.

It is requested that children wear house colours and suitable footwear. They will also require a hat, drink bottle and be sun screened.

All children are encouraged to participate as this is a House Points Carnival and Age Championships are up for grabs. Any child not able to participate will need to bring a signed note explaining the reason for their non-participation.



NAPLAN 2024

Attention - Parents and Carers of Year 3 and Year 5 students,

The National Assessment Program -Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) is a point in time assessment of literacy and numeracy skills. Each year students in Years 3 and 5 participate in tests for writing, reading, conventions of language (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and numeracy.

NAPLAN tests are just one part of our school learning assessment program and questions are primarily based on knowledge, understanding and skills gained from the prior year of schooling. In preparation for NAPLAN 2024, our school will undertake activities to help students to become familiar with the format and functionality of the online tests. These activities are not an assessment of student ability and will not be marked.

Students and parents can access the public demonstration site https;//www.nap.edu.au/online-assessment/public-demonstration-site to familiarise themselves with NAPLAN and the types of questions and tools available. Excessive preparation for NAPLAN is not required nor recommended.

It is important to understand that this is a point in time assessment of literacy and numeracy skills and that your child's classroom teacher is assisting and supporting them in readiness for NAPLAN.

We would like to remind you that it is important that students attend school on the scheduled assessment dates unless they are suffering from illness or injury.

Students will be participating in assessments on the following dates

Wed 13th March Morning Session -Writing Year 3 and Year 5 Thurs 14th March Morning Session -Reading Year 3 and Year 5 Thurs 14th March Middle Session -Conventions of Language Year 3 and Year 5 Monday 18th March Morning Session Numeracy Year 3 and Year 5

Safe on Social Media



Protect Your Child on Roblox: The Hidden Dangers Unveiled

The topic of Roblox in the classroom and at home continues here at school and so we're bringing your attention again to this popular and concerning game. We've spoken to our online safety partners, Safe on Social, to update our parent community to some disturbing updates to this game that parents should be aware of.

Safe on Social revealed to us nearly one-third of the students they've spoken to have been asked to be someone's boyfriend or girlfriend on Roblox! As the popularity of Roblox skyrockets, it's crucial to pause and consider the darker side of this virtual playground. Safe on Social is stepping up to reveal the truths behind Roblox—a platform that offers boundless fun but also presents very real dangers lurking beneath its surface.

There is a feature on Roblox we wanted to bring to your attention. Ro-Meet on Roblox isn't just a game; it's a Pandora's box of danger, masquerading as a 'friendly' chat room. Despite Roblox's claims to clamp down on stranger interaction, especially for those under 13, Ro-Meet is skirting around these controls, leaving kids wide open to potential harm.

RoZoom is also a feature similar to Zoom where strangers can chat to children. Despite Roblox's assurances of making it "extremely difficult" for strangers to contact kids, Ro-Meet is freely available in an 'All Ages' section, raising significant concerns about our children's safety online.

What can parents do?

Here are some tips from Safe on Social:

- Have honest conversations with your kids about the real dangers of talking to strangers and oversharing online. Educate them about the risks they may encounter on Roblox.
- each your children to question every interaction and piece of content they encounter online. Empower them to make informed decisions.
- Monitor what your children are playing, who they're chatting with, and where they're spending their time on Roblox.
- Activate every safety feature available on Roblox to enhance your child's online safety.
